Dear Ms. Lammi:

As a follow up to our phone conversation this morning, which also included Kenny Snetsinger, Wayde West and Matt Reid, the following shall summarize the two options that exist for proceeding forward on the project based on input from the State of Minnesota.


Option A:

Proceed with the design as previously shown, connected to the existing building with access thru the current mechanical room. Continuing as shown will require that a fire sprinkler system be added to the existing facility, throughout the entire building, per a Minnesota statute that overrules all building codes in place. Existing water service is not large enough to support this system, requiring a new water service be brought into the building with a connection to the main located in Kennedy Memorial Drive. Within the existing building, spaces or rooms with suspended ceilings would require a replacement of those ceilings for access above to install piping. The existing underground fuel tank would be required to be removed prior to construction as previously discussed. Early cost projections associated with the inclusion of the fire sprinkler system range from \$250,000 to \$300,000. Note, if the decision is made to not proceed with this option, it shall be advised that any future project that involves the addition to, remodeling of or alteration within, would most likely require a similar system be added at that time unless the statute language or plan review policy changes. Installation of the systems all but removes any limitations to future work within or additions to the building. See below for illustration.


Option B:

Remove the proposed mechanical room addition from the building, pulling it away as a stand alone building on the site. The new building would be located a minimum of 20', preferably closer to 30', from the existing buildings in order to avoid fire ratings at the existing building. Size, configuration and layout of the ice equipment would remain as previously designed. Piping between the detached building and the existing arena would connect underground, entering the arena roughly center ice, routing below the penalty box area. Being the new mechanical room would be a detached facility, access would be from the exterior of the building. While not required, maintaining the Vestibule within the newly detached building is recommended. Little to no additional costs are expected with this option. The existing underground fuel tank would no longer be in conflict of the proposed build and could remain in place if desired. All remaining work within the existing building (dasher boards, bleachers, piping/concrete slab) would be considered as "repair" by the state and would not require the inclusion of a fire sprinkler system to the project. Terms

- 1) ACCEPTANCE AND APPLICABILITY. The accompanying Invoice and these Terms (collectively, this "Agreement") comprise the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all prior or contemporaneous understandings, agreements, negotiations, representations and warranties, and communications, both written and oral. Delivery of any funds by Buyer constitutes acceptance of these Terms and approval of this Agreement. Seller's offer to sell Credits to Buyer pursuant to this Agreement shall automatically expire if no payment is received by the expiration date stated in the Invoice (the "Initial Payment Date").
- 2) <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this Agreement:
 - a. <u>BANK.</u> "Bank" shall mean the bank sponsored by Seller with mitigation credits for sale to the open market in connection with Wetland Conservation Act permit ("WCA")/Clean Water Act Section 404 Dredge and Fill permitted projects, as provided for by its Mitigation Banking Instrument ("MBI") approved by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("Corps").
 - b. <u>CREDITS.</u> "Credits" shall mean mitigation credits sold from the Bank as determined by the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources ("BWSR") and/or the Corps. Seller owns the Credits and has the right to sell the Credits to Buyer, and the Credits are deposited in the Sponsor-owned account associated with the Bank in the Minnesota Wetland Bank administered by BWSR pursuant to Minn. Rules, parts 8420.0700. 0760.
 - c. Capitalized terms not otherwise defined in these Terms shall have the meanings set forth in the Invoice.
- 3) <u>SUBSTITUTION</u>. Credits may come from any Bank owned by Seller, or its affiliated companies, with equivalent Credits for the Project's wetland replacement plan approved by the Local Government Unit ("LGU"), regardless of the description above.
- 4) <u>RESTRICTIONS.</u> Credits may be withdrawn for use to offset impacts associated with the Project. Credits may be used for alternative projects for which the Buyer is the permittee at Seller's discretion.
- 5) <u>DEPOSIT</u>. To secure a Reservation Period (as defined below), Buyer shall pay Seller a deposit of fifteen percent (15%) (the "Deposit) of the "Amount Due" (as calculated above). If Buyer wishes to extend the Reservation Period as provided for below, Buyer may pay Seller another fifteen percent (15%) deposit (the "Second Deposit"). The Deposit and the Second Deposit are applicable to the Purchase Price.
- 6) <u>PAYMENT TIMING.</u> On or before Initial Payment Date, Buyer shall pay Seller the Deposit or the Purchase Price. The balance of the Purchase Price less the Deposit and the Second Deposit (the "Balance of Purchase Price") is due from Buyer to Seller prior to expiration of the Reservation Period. All payments are non-refundable, except as allowed for in Section 9, below.
- 7) PAYMENT METHOD. All payments made pursuant to this Agreement shall be made to Seller. Buyer shall pay the Deposit, Second Deposit, Purchase Price, and Balance of Purchase Price (as applicable) by either a wire transfer or Automated Clearing House (ACH) transfer. Seller shall not accept payment in any form of check. In no instance shall Credits be transferred by Seller to Buyer prior to Seller having received full payment from Buyer for the Credits being transferred. Please contact sales@ecosystempartners.com to securely receive wire transfer / ACH payment instructions.
- 8) <u>CONTRACT TERM.</u> Upon receipt of the Purchase Price, Seller will reserve the purchased Credits as for a term period not to extend more than three (3) years from the Initial Payment Date (the "Term"). Any extension of the Term longer than three years is at the sole discretion of the Seller. Credits that have not been applied to an issued permit will be forfeited from the Buyer to the Seller without credit, refund, or offset upon Term expiration. Once such Credits are forfeited, they may not be reinstated.
- 9) <u>AVAILABILITY.</u> Credits are reserved on a first-come first-served basis. Seller makes no representation by way of issuing this Invoice that Credits will be available at the time Buyer submits the Deposit or the Purchase Price. If Credits are not currently available when Buyer pays to Seller the Deposit or the Purchase Price, at the Seller's discretion, Seller may (1) reserve the first available and applicable Credits from the next release, or (2) refund payment to Buyer.
- 10) <u>RESERVATION PERIOD.</u> Upon Seller's receipt of the Deposit, Seller will reserve the Credits for Buyer for one hundred eighty (180) days from the Effective Date ("Reservation Period"). If Buyer wishes to extend the Reservation Period by an additional ninety (90) days, Buyer shall pay to Seller the Second Deposit, for a maximum Reservation Period of two hundred seventy (270) days from the Effective Date, at the end of which the Balance of Purchase Price is due from Buyer to Seller.
- 11) <u>RESERVATION LETTER.</u> Within 3 business days of receiving a request from Buyer, Seller will convey a letter to Buyer indicating that the Credits have been reserved by Buyer for the then-applicable Reservation Period ("Reservation Letter").
- 12) <u>REQUIREMENT INCREASE.</u> Buyer may increase the number of Credits by written request to Seller, whereafter, contingent on Credit availability, will issue an updated invoice.
- 13) TRANSFER OF CREDITS. Within 10 business days of receipt by Seller of the Balance of the Purchase Price and the BWSR Check for the Total Fee, Buyer and Seller will execute a Transaction Form to Withdraw Credits in the form specified by BWSR ("BWSR Form") for a withdrawal of CREDITS Wetland Credits, distributed as shown on the Invoice. Seller will provide the fully executed BWSR Form, Sales Verification Notice, and the BWSR Check to BWSR, with a copy to Buyer.

- 14) <u>TERMINATION.</u> In addition to any remedies that may be provided under these Terms, Seller may terminate this Agreement with immediate effect upon written notice to Buyer, if Buyer: (a) fails to pay any amount when due under this Agreement; (b) has not otherwise performed or complied with any of these Terms, in whole or in part; or (c) becomes insolvent, files a petition for bankruptcy or commences or has commenced against it proceedings relating to bankruptcy, receivership, reorganization, or assignment for the benefit of creditors.
- SELLER'S COVENANTS AND REPRESENTATIONS. Seller represents that it is authorized by Corps and SWFWMD to sell Credits from the Bank in accordance with the MBI and SWFWMD Bank Permit. Seller shall be responsible for the development and maintenance of the Credits and the Bank in accordance with the requirements of the MBI and SWFWMD Bank Permit and other applicable laws. Seller has good and sufficient title to the Credits it will sell to Buyer. Buyer shall have no rights or obligations to perform any of the responsibilities of the Seller now or hereafter set forth by the Corps and SWFWMD regarding the development and maintenance of the Credits or the Bank nor shall Buyer have any rights or obligations to enforce any of the responsibilities of the Seller under the SWFWMD Bank Permit and the MBI.
- APPLICABLE LAW. Seller and Buyer shall be contractually bound to these Terms, which shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota and subject to the requirements of any applicable federal laws or regulations. Changes in federal, state, or local laws, which might have otherwise impacted this Agreement, shall not be enforced retroactively after execution of these Terms. Each party shall be held harmless for damages sustained by the other party as a result of changes in federal, state, or local laws pertaining to this transaction or the interpretation or enforcement of said changes.
- 17) ATTORNEYS' FEES. In the event any action, suit, or other proceeding at law or in equity is brought to enforce the covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement or to obtain monetary damages for breach thereof, and such action results in an award judgment for monetary damages, or the granting of any equitable relief in favor of any party hereto, all expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, of the successful party in such action, suit, or other proceeding shall, upon demand of such party, be paid by the other party.
- 18) <u>SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.</u> This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of Seller and Buyer, as the case may be, and their respective successors and assigns. Neither party hereto shall assign any interest hereunder without the prior written approval of the other, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

The City of Hoyt Lakes would like to comment on the CSAH 100 corridor study from MN Highway 135 to CSAH 110 through the City of Aurora.

The City of Hoyt Lakes has invested significant resources in the Laskin Industrial Park located on Colby Lake Road (CSAH 633), including the development of shovel-ready sites in conjunction with the Minnesota Department of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation and Minnesota Power.

During marketing activities of these industrial sites, we have received feedback on several occasions that the company is interested in building and establishing themselves in the City of Hoyt Lakes, but there continues to be one barrier – the logistics of shipping. They felt tractor-trailers were unable to successfully navigate the City of Aurora CSAH 100 corridor and requested a bypass be established. Unfortunately, the City was unsuccessful in lobbying the State of Minnesota and St. Louis County to establish an alternate route around the City of Aurora.

Additionally, there is significant need for another railroad crossing in the area. If there was an accident or other obstruction at the current location, Hoyt Lakes Emergency Services' alternate route to the northern part of Aurora is an additional 18 miles. The Hoyt Lakes Ambulance provides emergency medical response to the residents of Aurora and the Town of White.

We request, as part of this study, St. Louis County seriously consider an alternate route. One potential opportunity is Lane 55 (Rd. 371) to CSAH 100 (Rd. 341) with an additional railroad crossing.

11.9 City of Hoyt Lakes Hiring Policy.

At the regular council meeting on 01/08/2024, the committee recommendation to update regarding Fire Department hiring was an interview panel of 5, including the Hoyt Lakes Fire Chief, a Fire Chief from Aurora or Palo, the Personnel Committee and the City Administrator. This was recommended due to potential tiebreaking and scheduling issues with multiple Chiefs. Members of the Hoyt Lakes Fire Department who were present at the regular meeting opposed the recommendation for a 5-member hiring committee and requested the hiring committee be made up of the Fire Chiefs from Aurora, Hoyt Lakes, and Palo along with the Personnel Committee and City Administrator. The City Council approved the changes to the Hiring Policy for a 6-member interview panel.

On 04/03/2024 Chief House requested the Hiring Policy be updated to allow the Assistant Chiefs from Aurora or Palo be allowed to interview candidates if the Chiefs from those departments were unavailable, as Chief House has had trouble with scheduling with the Aurora and Palo Chiefs. Additionally, he has requested waiving the interview requirement if there is only one qualified applicant. These changes will not address the tiebreaking issue.

City of Hoyt Lakes Hiring Policy

<u>General Information:</u> The City of Hoyt Lakes would like a uniform, consistent process for hiring employees for all departments.

Vacancy:

When an employee resigns, retires, or is terminated, the City Council will indicate a need to hire for the position. The City Administrator will oversee the hiring process.

Advertisement:

Advertisements for full-time permeant positions will be posted with the Mesabi Tribune, Duluth News Tribune, League of Minnesota Cities, East Range Shopper, and Minnesota Works. Advertisements for part-time positions will be posted with the Mesabi Tribune, East Range Shopper, and Minnesota Works. If the position is for the Fire or EMS Department, the Facebook page may also be utilized for advertisement. The City Administrator will determine the length of advertisement; some positions, such as firefighter, may always be open for application.

Applications:

All applicants shall utilize the same employment application. The City Administrator is responsible for updating and maintaining the employment application. If an incomplete application is received, the application will be discarded. Applications received after the deadline will be discarded.

Application Scoring:

An application scoring committee consisting of the Personnel Committee, City Administrator, and Department Head will score the applications for interview for non-seasonal positions.

Applicant Written Testing:

For the Fire and EMS Department, written testing may be required. This test is not pass/fail, and is instead a ranked scoring between applicants.

Interview:

An interview committee consisting of the Personnel Committee, City Administrator, and Department Head will interview the employees for the following departments: Administration, Recreation, Golf, Arena, Public Works, Public Utilities, and full-time permanent members of the Fire and EMS Department.

An interview committee consisting of the Personnel Committee, City Administrator, Hoyt Lakes Fire Chief, and the Fire Chiefs of the Aurora and Palo Fire Department (or Assistant Chiefs of the Aurora and Palo Departments, if the Chief is unavailable) will interview for the Hoyt Lakes Fire Department Officer positions. If only one qualified candidate is received, interviews will not be conducted.

An interview committee consisting of three members of neighboring departments and two Hoyt Lakes Fire Department members will interview initial casual part-time Fire and EMS applicants.

Physical Agility Test:

Fire and EMS applicants will be subject to a physical agility test.

EMS Applicants: Two-person lift of a cot including Rescue Randy (180lbs) in to an ambulance. Three attempts allowed for each task.

Firefighter/EMS Applicants: Two-person lift of a cot including Rescue Randy (180lbs) in to an ambulance. Lift and hold Hurst Tool for a total of one minute and thirty seconds at shoulder height. Move Rescue Randy (180lbs) 25 yards in 45 seconds or less, in any manner without mechanical assistance. Swear self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) in a smoke filled or dark room for no less than five minutes. Climb to the top of a 35ft. two-stage ladder wearing full turnout gear. Stretch 100ft. of uncharged 1 ½ inch hose and operate nozzle at 80psi. Walk entire length of a 15ft, 4-inch-wide beam wearing full turnout gear without stepping off. Three attempts allowed for each task.

Reference Checks:

After the interview, a member of the interview committee will contact references for the top three candidates (or all successful candidates, for the Fire/EMS Department).

Recommendation to Hire:

After all pre-employment tasks are complete (written exam, interview, physical agility test, reference checks), the interview committee will make a recommendation to the City Council for hire.

Post-Hiring Requirements:

All full-time employees, firefighters, and EMS employees are subject to a Bureau of Criminal Apprehension or East Range Police Department background check, physical exam, and drug screen.

Seasonal employees are subject only to a driver's license check by the East Range Police Department.

Rehire of Employees:

Employees who left in good standing will be eligible for re-hire, subject to the above requirements. Firefighters or EMS employees who have current licensure are exempt from the written exam portion only.

Emergency Hiring:

The City Administrator has authority to hire temporary employees for no more than 30 days in an emergency situation.
